



2023 - 2025 PRIORITIES

Common Agenda: To build a community in which every child and youth is safe, healthy, valued and lives in a family and neighborhood where: all babies have the best start possible; all children and youth are cared for and safe; all children are ready for school; all children and youth are successful at school; all children and youth are practicing safe and healthy behaviors; and all youth are making successful transitions to adulthood.

To move closer to realizing these goals the collaborative identified that the years of the pandemic have negatively impacted children, youth, families, and human services agencies. The issues facing children, youth and families have become more complex, while service providers are fatigued and experiencing high rates of staff turnover and vacancies. It is within this context that the priorities of data (understanding our community today) and organizational resilience were prioritized. EKIOC provides a continuous communication loop between partners. These collective work priorities must have equity at their center.
