INFANT FEEDING CLINICS

During your visit to the clinic, a registered nurse will: Provide prenatal breastfeeding education before baby arrives. Provide one-on-one support to help you feed your baby.

- ✓ Assess your baby to make sure they are growing well and meeting their growth milestones.
- ✓ Guide you to learn your baby's feeding cues so that you know when your baby is hungry or full.
- ✓ Teach you the signs to know that your baby is feeding well.
- ✓ Give you tips to help you with common breastfeeding challenges.
- ✓ Give you the chance to ask questions you may have about feeding your baby.

LANGUAGE EXPRESS PRESCHOOL SPEECH AND LANGUAGE PROGRAM

Language Express provides free speech and language assessment and therapy services for children from birth until Junior Kindergarten in Lanark, Leeds, and Grenville Counties.

If you have concerns about your child's speech and language, don't wait and see! We can help:

- If your child is not meeting all of the communication milestones for their age. Go to www.language-express.ca to complete the Language Express Communications Checkup.
- If your child is stuttering.
- If your child's play or social interaction seems different from other children the same age.
- If your child's voice doesn't sound right.
- If your child has a diagnosis, such as: hearing loss, Autism Spectrum Disorder, or developmental delay.

Language Express accepts referrals for children from birth until September 1 of the year they turn 4. For example, children born in 2020 must be referred by September 1, 2024. SMARTSTART HUBS

Wondering where to turn with concerns regarding your child's development? SmartStart Hubs are located in every region of the province and they provide the following:

- a clear point of entry to child development services for parents and caregivers who have concerns about the child's development.
- a one-stop point of entry for families who have concerns about their child's development and would like to explore available options and supports.
- connect families with child development agencies and professionals, giving them seamless connections to assessments and services in a family-friendly environment.
- for eligible children birth to age 19, or 21 if they are in school and live in Ontario (they do not need a diagnosis if you don't have one).

ONTARIO'S ENHANCED 18 MONTH WELL BABY VISIT

18 months is a critical time in a child's development and a visit to a health care provider at this time is important. Ontario offers a longer, more in depth visit with your health care provider at 18-months, as it is the last in a series of scheduled health care visits prior to a child starting school. During the visit with a health care provider, parents will have an opportunity to discuss their child's growth and development and ask questions they may have regarding healthy child development. HEALTHY BABIES, HEALTHY CHILDREN

A free program that provides home visits by public health nurses and home visitors to pregnant women and families with children who have not yet started school. Home visits help you learn about:

- Having a healthy pregnancy and birth.
- Connecting with your child(ren).
- How children grow and develop as well as what you can do to help.
- Being a parent.
- Breastfeeding, food and healthy nutrition.
- Taking care of yourself and your family.
- Other services available to you and your child in your community.

ORAL HEALTH EDUCATION AND DENTAL SCREENING

The dental team from Leeds, Grenville and Lanark District Health Unit will provide oral health information and dental screening for children. Fluoride varnish may be provided. Verbal or written consent is required. The dental team will also assist eligible families apply for the Healthy Smiles Ontario Program. Free. HEALTHY SMILES ONTARIO (H.S.O.)

Consists of 3 dental programs for eligible children 17 years and younger:

1. H.S.O. Basic Program (Core) - Family must meet an income level to qualify, based on the number of children 17 and under in the family.
2. H.S.O. Emergency Program – Child has an urgent dental need, such as pain, infection, or large visual decay and the cost of dental treatment would create a financial hardship.
3. Preventive Services Program - Child has a preventive dental need (scaling, fluoride, and/or dental sealants) and the cost would create a financial hardship. Preventive services must be provided by Health Unit staff. Families with access to other dental insurance may still be eligible to apply. Availability of the preventative services program may be affected by COVID-19.

FIRST YEAR, FIRST VISIT

The Canadian Dental Association encourages the assessment of infants by the dentist, within 6 months of the eruption of the first tooth or by 12 months of age. Prior to the first visit with the dentist, a health unit dental hygienist can provide and demonstrate oral care techniques for infants and young children. If it is a financial hardship for the family to cover the cost of the first visit to the dentist, the dental hygienist may also provide screening to determine eligibility for coverage under the Healthy Smiles Ontario program. The visit with the health unit dental hygienist does not replace an exam with the dentist, but does support the recommendation for collaboration between dental and health care providers to promote oral health. FLUORIDE VARNISH PROGRAM

The Oral Health Program of the Leeds, Grenville and Lanark District Health Unit supports the evidence that applying fluoride varnish is a safe and effective part of a cavity prevention program. Please check with your dental provider to find out how fluoride varnish can benefit your child. Free to children who meet eligibility criteria.
