Quantitative Data Collection and Analysis

- High level review of FCSLLG referral data 2020-2025
- High level review of Triple P data from 2020-2025

Qualitative Data Collection and Synthesis

- Survey/interview past and present Triple P practitioners and steering committee members
- Survey of other regional child and family planning tables



Project Plan

Literature Review

- What parent education programs exist to build family competence/resilience or reduce the risk of child maltreatment?
- Results were limited to peer review-type evidence (systematic reviews, scoping reviews, rapid reviews or narrative reviews)
- Narrative summary of the results will be completed

Grey Literature Review

- Review of parenting programs and parenting resources offered by Ontario Public Health Units and Health Agencies across Canada.

Qualitative Review

Literature Review

- In progress-end of September

Grey Literature Review

- In progress, but on hold pending capacity
